#### 第3問 次の英文をよく読んで、以下の問いに答えなさい。(それぞれの段落には番号がついています。)

[1] Look at this kanji. Do you know what it means? From the left part, you can guess that it is a fish name. However, you may get confused when you look at the right part. That is mainly because you know that fish do not fly. There are many different kinds of fish in rivers, lakes, and the sea. Read the two parts from right to left. Then you will remember that there is one exception. Yes, this kanji means "flying fish." They are usually called tobiuo in Japanese.



- [2] Flying fish live in areas with warmer water around the world. They are found in the top part of the sea. In some countries, people catch many flying fish and eat them in different ways. For example, Japanese people eat them as soup or sushi. They are important to Japanese food culture.
- [3] Have you ever seen a flying fish? If you go to a supermarket or fish shop in summer, you may be able to see one. The flying fish is about 30 centimeters long. There are three interesting parts of its body. First, it has a thin, light body. It does not have a stomach, so it does not keep much food inside its body. Second, it has a V-shaped tail which helps it to go very fast. Due to this, it can speed up and jump out of the water. Third, it has two long \*fins. When the fins are open, they are much larger than the fins of other fish. They are strong enough to catch the wind like the wings of birds. These three parts help it increase its speed in the water and move through the air.
- [4] Flying fish are famous for their unique ability to "fly." However, they cannot move their fins like birds. In fact, they jump up from the water and move from wave to wave. First, they keep their fins close to their bodies and move their tails. Then they speed up and get to the top of a wave. Next, they jump out of the water, begin to move on the top of the water with their tails, and spread their fins in the air. With a good wind, they can move in the air for almost one minute and travel hundreds of meters.
- [5] Since it is impossible for flying fish to take a breath in the air, why do they need to jump into the world without water? At first, many people thought that their behavior was a way to travel, but many experts now agree that they jump our of the water in order to escape other animals which kill and eat them. These animals often attack them from below. If they go down, they will fall into the mouths of the animals. In addition, there is no place to hide in the top part of the sea. So they need to go up and finally jump out of the water. Unfortunately, this is a very good chance that sea birds have been waiting for. If flying fish go too high, they may be eaten by birds. Bigger fish attack them from below, while sea birds watch them carefully above the sea. It is very hard for flying fish to survive in the natural world.

- [1] When I was fifteen years old, I didn't like myself very much. I compared myself with other people all the time. I was always depressed that I was not good at anything. For example, my classmates did well in schoolwork, but I didn't. I was on the basketball team but could not play well like my teammates. I thought that I had to work harder. I actually worked very hard. However, I made a lot of mistakes because I was always in a hurry. These mistakes made me more and more fustrated. Finally, I didn't know what to do. That was my problem.
- [2] In January, there was a marathon race in Moriyama. I didn't participate in the race but volunteered with my sister, Yuko. About 5,000 people started from the stadium, ran through the city, and returned to the stadium. They had to run 20 kilometers within two hours. We gave water to the runners and cheered for them.
- [3] We saw many people running. At the end, an older man was running very hard. I guessed that he was almost seventy years old. He was moving very slowly, but he didn't stop or walk. He was looking forward and going at his own pace. I was afraid that he could not return to the stadium within two hours. However, he didn't slow down. We ran after him. At the 15-kilometer point, he gradually picked up the pace. Everyone was cheering for him.
- [4] I went to the stadium with Yuko. We came to the finish line and waited for the man. When he ran into the stadium, many people cheered for him and encouraged him. He kept running on the track at his own pace, but he looked tired. I shouted, "Never give up!" We were holding a tape at the finish line.
- (5) At last, he broke the tape in 1 hour and 57 minutes. I was so happy that I cried. We went to him. He was sitting down on the field. He looked tired, but he was fine. Yuko said, "You did a great job! Here you are." She gave him a water bottle, and I passed him a towel. Then he smiled and said, "Thank you very much." After a while, I asked him, "How was the race?" He answered, "I had a good time. I ran the whole race at my own pace. My goal was to cross the finish line within two hours. Many people ginspired me, so I've achieved my goal. I'm very happy." He looked very excited.
- [6] From this experience, I learned how to solve my problem. This man was not swayed by the other runners around him. They were running faster than him but he didn't mind. At his own pace, he did everything he could do to realize his goal.

I thought the man was cool and wanted to be like him.

[7] Three years have passed since that time. I want to be a teacher in the future, so I must enter college and learn a lot of things. Like the last runner in the marathon race, I do everything at my own pace. Now I feel more positive and like myself better than before. Life is a marathon, not a sprint.
